- **Arqiva provides BGAN terminal to provide IPÊ and Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust with satcoms for field operations in remote locations**

Arqiva has provided the IPÊ and Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust with a BGAN (Broadband Global Area Network) terminal which delivers mobile satellite based voice and data communications for field workers. This provides field teams with direct telephone communications, essential to their safety in remote locations, and also enables them to access email, the internet and other data services.

Mark Cronin, Technology Director at Arqiva Satellite & Media, said: “We have long supported the work of the IPÊ and Durrell Wildlife, contributing technology and planting some 70,000 trees as part of their ‘conservation tree corridor’ project in Brazil. Many of Arqiva’s core satellite services are designed to bring reliable, mission critical communications to the world’s most remote locations – exactly the sort of locations where IPÊ and Durrell Wildlife need to operate.
